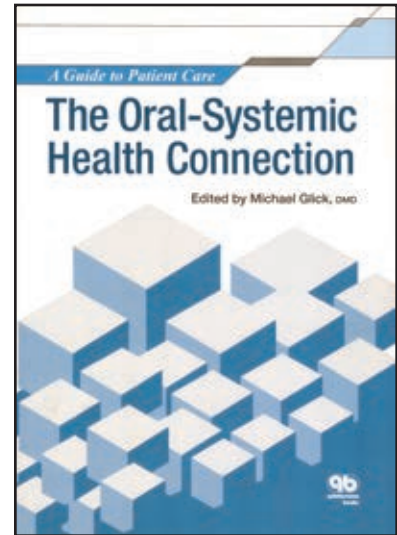
The Oral-Systemic Health Connection: A Guide to Patient Care

This book, authored by experts in oral medicine, periodontology, epidemiology, and microbiology, provides information on the relationship between the oral

environment and general health. Chapters address techniques used to screen for conditions such as heart disease and diabetes in the dental setting, associations between oral health and systemic disease, mechanisms of oral-systemic interactions, the relationship between periodontal infections and adverse pregnancy outcomes, and more, each ending with clinical considerations. The text aims to provide readers with information that can be applied to guide treatment decisions and prevention strategies, as well as to gain a better understanding of the evidence surrounding connections between oral and overall health.
